County Recorder Defendants must permit voters to “cure” early ballots until 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 14, 2018. “Cure” means the same governmental acts taken prior to the General Election to allow a voter to confirm their early ballot vote.

Plaintiffs’ counsel adds that the parties shall bear their own attorneys’ fees.

The Court polls the parties individually.

Intervenors League of Women Voters, League of United Latin American Citizens of Arizona, and Arizona Advocacy Network Foundation do not object to the Settlement.

All remaining parties agree to the terms of the Settlement.

Counsel Colleen Connor does not represent Greenlee County Recorder or La Paz County Recorder, but has received emails from Robert Gilliland who represents the Greenlee County Recorder, and Ryan Dooley, who represents the La Paz County Deputy Attorney, who both agree to the Settlement.

Counsel Colleen Connor has also communicated with counsel Jason Moore representing Navajo County Recorder who has expressed that Navajo County is in agreement with the Settlement.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED all parties shall conduct themselves fully in compliance with the terms of the Settlement.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED Plaintiffs shall submit to the Court a form of Order consistent with the Settlement by 5:00 p.m. today.
