Dear Chairman Guest and Ranking Member Wild:

Campaign Legal Center (“CLC”) respectfully requests that the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Ethics (“Ethics Committee”) disclose whether it has approved privately sponsored trips for members that do not comply with the House Travel Regulations. Specifically, a review of the Ethics Committee’s current travel approvals in 2023, reveals that 48% violate the regulations due to missing information. The public is unable to know with certainty which members accepted free travel from private sources due to the incomplete forms. Consequently, multiple members appear to have violated the gift rules and federal law by attending trips without approval or disclosure.

The details of the members’ travel are one of the most important public disclosures because, as the Ethics Committee advises, “travel may be among the most attractive and expensive gifts” a member receives. “[T]hus before accepting travel, a Member, officer, or employee should exercise special care to ensure compliance with the gift rule and other applicable laws, rules, and regulations.”¹

The purpose of the disclosures is to inform the public of potential conflicts of interests that may arise between the sponsor and attendees of a multi-day trip with a member. However, the Ethics Committee’s failure to enforce its disclosure rules

leaves the public in the dark and has become a widespread problem. Lax ethics enforcement of the basic rules fosters a culture of non-compliance with all rules.

In particular, gift travel filings published by the Clerk of the House of Representatives from January 1 to July 10, 2023, have the following substantial discrepancies with the disclosure requirements of the Traveler Form, Primary Sponsor Form, Member/Officer Post-Travel Disclosure Form, and/or Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form published by this Committee:

- **47.9%** are missing at least one of the key parts of the submission or were approved for their trip despite failing to submit their pre-trip request to the Committee at least 30 days before departure. As a result, the Committee has enabled a practice where nearly half of the submissions are non-compliant.
- **36.6%** are missing the personalized agenda: “show[ing] the traveler’s individual schedule, including departure and arrival times and identify[ing] the specific events in which the traveler will be participating.”² Without this information, it is impossible for the public to know whether the trip complies with the requirement for travel to have an official purpose and not a recreational purpose.
- **9.2%** are missing the required “names and titles of ALL House Members *and* employees [invited].”³ Without this information, it is impossible for the public to know all of the members who may have attended the trip and accepted free travel expenses.
- **11.3%** were approved for their trip, despite failing to submit their pre-trip disclosure request to the Committee at least 30 days before departure.⁴ Failure to enforce the deadline results in less time for adequate evaluation of the travel request and may contribute to the significant number of incomplete filings.

CLC respectfully requests that the Ethics Committee disclose whether the member requests for privately sponsored, officially connected travel discussed herein are in compliance with House Rule 25, and if so, provide further clarification on how the rule is applied and enforced.
