Dear Chairman Coons and Vice Chairman Lankford:

Campaign Legal Center ("CLC") respectfully requests that the U.S. Senate Select Committee on Ethics ("Ethics Committee") disclose whether it has approved privately sponsored trips for Senators that do not comply with Senate Travel Regulations. Specifically, a review of the Ethics Committee's travel approvals in 2023 reveals that 47% violate the regulations due to missing information. The public is unable to know with certainty which Senators accepted free travel from private sources due to the incomplete forms. Consequently, multiple Senators appear to have violated the gift rules and federal law by attending trips without approval or proper disclosure.

The purpose of the travel disclosure rules is to inform the public of potential conflicts of interests that may arise between the sponsor and attendees of a multiday trip with a Senator. However, the Ethics Committee's failure to enforce its disclosure rules leaves the public in the dark and has become a widespread problem. Lax ethics enforcement of the basic rules fosters a culture of noncompliance with all rules.

In particular, gift travel filings published by the Senate Office of Public Records from January to July 10, 2023, have the following substantial discrepancies with the disclosure requirements of the Private Sponsor Travel Certification Form and Post Travel Disclosure of Expenses Form:

• 47% are missing at least one of the key parts of the submission. As a result, the Committee has enabled a practice where nearly half of the submissions are non-compliant.

- **29.4%** are missing or have an incomplete "final approved itinerary." Without this information, it is impossible for the public to know whether the trip complies with the requirement for travel to have an official purpose and not a recreational purpose.
- 11.8% are missing the "final Private Sponsor Travel Certification Form with all attachments."²
- 11.8% are missing the "final invitation" from the Trip Sponsor.³ Without this information, it is impossible for the public to know all of the members who may have attended the trip and accepted free travel expenses.
- 11.8% include an incomplete Post Travel Disclosure of Expenses Form.⁴

CLC respectfully requests that the Ethics Committee disclose whether the member requests for privately sponsored, officially connected travel discussed herein are in compliance with Senate Rule 35, and if so, provide further clarification on how the rule is applied and enforced.
