

## What is voter intimidation?

- Yelling, disrupting, harassing, filming or following you in a menacing manner, or interrogating you because of your voting activity
- Confronting you at a voting location or at your home while pretending to be an election worker or government official to interrogate you about your voting activity
- Threatening—by phone, mail or in person—that your voting activity will result in your loss of rights, financial impacts or criminal consequences
- Harassing you at drop boxes or brandishing weapons or guns at drop boxes or polling places
- Spreading your information online without your consent because of your voting activity or publishing falsehoods about your voter eligibility

## What should I do if I see or experience voter intimidation?

- 1. Document what happened:
- What happened?
- Where and when did it happen?
- Who was intimidated from voting?
- Do you know the name or can you describe who did the intimidating?
