## BEFORE YOU RESTORE YOUR RIGHTS:



1. You have to complete your sentence, including probation and parole.



2. You must pay off your restitution and court costs, and be up to date on child support.

## **HOW TO RESTORE YOUR RIGHTS:**



- 1. **Check if you can apply:** In Tennessee, if you've served your time, including probation and parole, and paid all fines, fees & restitution, you can apply.
- 2. File a Petition with the Circuit Court to restore your rights: This can be filed in the jurisdiction where you live or where the felony conviction occurred.
- 3. Ask for a completed Certificate of Restoration form: You can download this form from the State Department's website in Tennessee or ask for it by mail. You will need qualified agencies to confirm on the form that you have paid all court costs, completed your sentence, and paid child support. You should include a copy of the order from Circuit Court with this form.
- 4. Wait for an answer: The Secretary of State in Tennessee will check your Certificate of Restoration form. If they say yes, you will get a letter stating that your voting rights are back.



#### **Packet for Restoration of Rights of Citizenship**

For People with a Tennessee felony conviction after July 1, 1996

This packet will help you fill out the necessary paperwork to ask a Circuit Court to restore your full citizenship rights. The steps are:

#### Step 1: Collect certified judgements for each of your felony convictions.

Go to each Court where you were convicted of a felony. Ask the court clerk for a <u>certified</u> copy of your felony judgements. You must do this for each felony on your record. You <u>must</u> attach these certified copies to your citizenship restoration petition.

Step 2: Complete the paperwork you need to restore your citizenship rights.
$\square$ Complete the Pro Se Petition to Restore Full Rights of Citizenship in this
packet to ask the court to restore your rights.
$\square$ Complete an Affidavit of Indigency in this packet to ask the court not to
charge you the filing fee for submitting this petition. If you <b>CAN</b> afford to pay the
filing fee you do not need to complete this affidavit.
$\square$ Fill in your name on a Proposed Order in this packet to submit to the court.
Step 3: Put the above documents together and file them with the Circuit

Court. Bring the Petition for Citizenship Rights, the Affidavit of Indigency, and Proposed Order to the Circuit Court where you live or where your felony conviction occurred. View a map of Tennessee Circuit Courts here:

## PRO SE PETITION TO RESTORE FULL RIGHTS OF CITIZENSHIP PURSUANT TO TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED SECTION 40-29-101-105(c)

Comes now Petitioner, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §40-29-101–105(c), respectfully requesting that this Honorable Court grant me an order restoring my full rights of citizenship. This Court has jurisdiction to hear this petition under Tenn. Code Ann. §40-29-10(c)5 as a circuit court in the county in which I reside, or which has jurisdiction over the disqualifying felony offense(s).

To restore citizenship rights, a person with a disqualifying conviction after July 1, 1996, must: (1) submit their petition in the circuit court of the county where they reside or where they were convicted; (2) wait until the expiration of the maximum sentence imposed by the court; and (3) set forth the reasons petitioner is eligible for and merits having full rights of citizenship restored. Tenn. Code Ann.§40-29-105(c). As explained below, I am eligible to have my rights restored and I merit restoration.

Under Tenn. Code Ann. §40-29-105(c)(3), there is a presumption in my favor that this petition shall be granted and that full citizenship rights shall be restored. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-29-105(c)(5), "If, upon the face of the petition or after conducting a hearing, the court finds that the petitioner's full citizenship rights should be restored, it shall so order and send a copy of the order to the state coordinator of elections." I respectfully requests that this Court

grant the petition on its face unless the Court finds it necessary to hold a hearing or request additional documentation.
