

# Former Lobbyists Now Have Unlimited Access to Lead the Agencies They Lobbied

Executive branch officials hold powerful positions in government and make decisions that affect the daily lives of Americans. These officials should be focused on the needs of the public and avoid even the appearance that they are influenced by their own interests or those of private industries.

Unfortunately, President Donald Trump has nominated at least 21 former lobbyists to senior executive branch positions.¹ Contrary to the ethics rules of prior administrations, many of these nominees lobbied on behalf of the industries they now regulate, some as recently as the month prior to their official nomination. This influx of former lobbyists into agency leadership roles demonstrates the need for Congress to codify the political appointee ethics pledge. President Trump has not implemented this once bipartisan practice, and as a result, numerous senior officials are currently serving in government with clear conflicts of interest.

# THE PAST THREE ADMINISTRATIONS LIMITED THE ROLE OF LOBBYISTS IN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH

Executive orders from presidents of both parties have required ethics pledges restricting the appointment of lobbyists to senior agency positions, but the current administration did not establish such rules. Under both the <u>Biden</u> and <u>Obama</u> administrations, registered lobbyists were prohibited from seeking or accepting employment with any executive agency they lobbied within the two years before their date of appointment.

Under the <u>first Trump administration</u>, registered lobbyists were prohibited from participating in any particular matter they lobbied on within the two years before their appointment, as well as from participating in the specific issue area in which the particular matter falls.

#### THESE INDIVIDUALS HAVE SIGNIFICANT CONFLICTS WITHOUT SAFEGUARDS

The above individuals have clear and current conflicts of interest but, due to President Trump's failure to implement ethics rules, can be appointed to their positions with no safeguards to protect the public interest.

For example, Wayne Palmer, the Assistant Secretary of the Department of Labor for Mine Safety and Health, <u>lobbied the Mine Safety and Health Administration</u> in every quarter of 2023 and 2024 on behalf of the Essential Minerals Association. While Alex Dominguez, the Deputy Assistant Administrator for Mobile Sources of the Environmental Protection Agency <u>lobbied on behalf of the American Petroleum Institute</u> for the first two quarters of 2023. Both of these individuals will work directly with their former clients and will be put in the position of making decisions that will affect those companies less than two years after they represented them.

### CONGRESS SHOULD PASS LEGISLATION TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC FROM CLEAR CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Given President Trump's unwillingness to implement restrictions on executive branch lobbyists, we call on Congress to act by introducing legislation to codify the ethics requirements of prior administrations. Registered lobbyists should be banned from seeking or accepting employment with any executive agency they lobbied within the two years before their date of appointment. In the event registered lobbyists were appointed to an agency they did not lobby, they should still be prohibited from participating in any matter they lobbied on, or issues in which the particular matter falls, within the two years before their appointment.

No matter the party in power, Americans should be assured that government officials are acting in their interest and not for their own gain or their industry's benefit. To help restore trust in government, Congress must act.
