Dear Chairman Guest and Ranking Member DeSaulnier:

Campaign Legal Center ("CLC") respectfully requests that the U.S. House Ethics Committee ("Ethics Committee") investigate the missing candidate personal financial disclosure reports for at least 66 House candidates in 27 states and two U.S. territories. These individuals appear to have qualified as candidates pursuant to the Ethics in Government Act ("EIGA") but do not have the requisite financial disclosures on file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. All these candidates are still running for office: 61 have won their primaries or have otherwise advanced to the general elections in November, and 8 will face primaries in November. The vast majority, 59 of the candidates, represent one of the two major parties.

When candidates fail to file their financial disclosure reports accurately and on time, they deprive voters of crucial information about the financial interests of those who hope to represent them. In order to make an informed decision at the ballot box, voters need to know about any potential conflicts of interest their Congressional candidates may have, and whether the claims made to voters align with their personal finances.

In some cases, the failure to accurately and timely file these reports puts even more at stake than the voters' informational interests. The missing or inaccurate reports can conceal critical details from the Ethics Committee, the Office of Congressional Conduct, or law enforcement, including facts about how a campaign for Congress is ultimately funded. For example, 25 of the candidates who have failed to file financial disclosure reports have reported making personal loans to their principal campaign committees. Financial disclosure reports would indicate whether the candidates have sufficient funds or assets to make those loans; absent those reports, voters, law enforcement, and the general public are deprived of information about the true sources of money used to influence their elections. Comparing



financial disclosure reports with campaign finance records has repeatedly revealed critical information for voters and law enforcement.¹

Several 2026 candidates have claimed to loan their campaigns significant sums but failed to file financial disclosure reports to support these claims. For example:

- David Flippo, the Republican nominee for Nevada’s 2nd Congressional District, has reported loaning his campaign \$1.6 million.²
- Michael Echols, a candidate for the Republican nomination for Louisiana’s 5th Congressional District, has reported that \$2.4 million out of the \$3 million raised came from his personal funds.³
- Mark Tedford, the Republican nominee for Oklahoma’s 1st Congressional District, has reported loaning his campaign \$1.3 million dollars.⁴
- Jonny Larsen, the Democratic nominee for Utah’s 4th Congressional District, has reported loaning his committee \$36,000.⁵

In the wake of the expulsion of one member of Congress and the resignation of another due in part to fraudulent candidate financial disclosure reports,⁶ it is more important than ever for the Ethics Committee to transparently enforce the existing rules that govern missing, late, and inaccurate filings; reform internal processes that ensure timely filing; and provide updated, detailed guidance on requirements for filing financial disclosure reports.

I. House Candidates Are Required by Law to File Timely and Accurate Financial Disclosure Reports with the Clerk of the House of Representatives

EIGA requires House candidates to file personal financial disclosure reports with the Clerk of the House of Representatives “within 30 days of becoming a candidate” as defined in the Federal Campaign Act of 1971 or on or before May 15, whichever is later.⁷ Further, candidates must file no later than 30 days before their election, including primaries.⁸ Candidates that qualify during non-election years likely owe two personal financial disclosure reports.⁹

A candidate is an individual who “seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and . . . has received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.”¹⁰ Funds raised and spent while an individual is testing the waters for possible candidacy do not themselves trigger candidacy, but they do count toward the threshold once an individual decides to become a candidate.¹¹

EIGA allows for “reasonable extensions of time for filing any report” by the supervising ethics authority, but the extensions cannot exceed 90 days.¹² The House may not grant an extension after 30 days following a report’s due date.¹³ A candidate filing their report more than 30 days after it is due must pay a \$200 penalty *unless waived by the Ethics Committee*; a waiver is granted only in extraordinary circumstances.¹⁴

The Ethics Committee reviews each personal financial disclosure report for timeliness and accuracy and to determine whether it “compl[ies] with applicable laws and rules.”¹⁵ The Ethics Committee may initiate action on their own or refer to the Attorney General if the

reports show reasonable cause to believe knowing and willful violations of EIGA occurred.¹⁶ Anyone who knowingly and willfully “makes any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation” on their financial disclosure reports may face fines or imprisonment.¹⁷ “A statutory violation is knowing and willful when an individual intentionally disregards the statute or is indifferent to its requirements.”¹⁸

II. At Least 66 House Candidates in 27 States and Two U.S. Territories Have Failed to Timely File Personal Financial Disclosure Reports

At least 66 House candidates competing in Congressional races in 27 states and two U.S. territories appear to have met the threshold requirements for filing personal financial disclosure reports without having filed any reports with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. Virtually all of these candidates have declared their candidacy with an FEC Form 2, meaning all funds they had raised or spent testing the waters would factor into the \$5,000 candidate threshold.¹⁹ Each candidate had raised or spent \$5,000 at the time they declared their candidacy or at some point thereafter in 2025 or 2026. After raising or spending \$5,000 and declaring their candidacy, each candidate was required to file at least one personal financial disclosure report with the House Clerk.²⁰

Each of the individuals listed below have qualified as House candidates under EIGA, but do not have a publicly available personal financial disclosure report on file with the House Clerk as of September 11, 2026.²¹
